3 Simple Steps Toward Cultivating Warm Charisma:

- 1** Embrace your own warmth and kindness. These underrated traits make up the most powerful form of charisma (and women have the advantage)!
- 2** Pay attention to body language and don't be afraid to bring up how someone else might be feeling. Know how to use your own body language to portray the right message.
- 3** Practice re-writing reality. For example, write yourself an apology letter from someone who wronged you. Or use meditation as a tool to maintain warmth even when things are difficult or out of your control.
